local women and mothers of students.

The workshop focussed on earning while learning and the students acquired a skill that would be beneficial in the long run. The programme was held with a view to equip students with a skill that will later help them to earn pocket money or livelihood. There is a great demand for organic pesticides in day-to-day life and these could be made without much time and expense. Learning such skills enables the students to channelize their energy and time towards useful purposes. Moreover, the organic pesticides were made of natural and cheaply available materials that have the properties of killing or keeping pests away from crop fields. The products made were more environmental-friendly and safe for the user. Organic pesticides breakdown naturally, reducing the chance of polluting or contaminating the soil or water. When applied correctly, they can be very effective at pest control and can act as growth accelerators.
